OTHER INFORMATION

- **The department will be hosting an Advanced Roadside Impairment Enforcement Class through the PA DUI Association in July. This class will be available to all area Law Enforcement Agencies.**

Newport Township Parks and Recreation Report

May 4, 2026

Restroom Facilities:

The Newport Township Recreational Park's restroom and storage area floors have been significantly improved with the application of "Rock Hard coating". This surface restoration enables easier cleaning and provides a brighter, more suitable finish to the existing concrete flooring.

Free Standing Charcoal Grills:

The previous charcoal grills have been replaced with newly installed units, ensuring clean and safe equipment for public outdoor grilling. Two grills have been positioned adjacent to each pavilion, and the surrounding base areas have been restored.

Removal and Restoration:

In order to promote a safe public environment, the Newport Township Maintenance Staff has undertaken the removal of concrete slabs and tree stumps, as well as contour restoration within designated public areas. This maintenance initiative will be extended to the outer sections of the park as the season progresses.

Field Preparation:

Recreational play areas have been prepared and are now open for use. Maintenance procedures will be followed throughout the season to ensure that all scheduled events occur as planned. These efforts include regular tree and brush cutting along the walking trail. Additionally, volunteers are consistently collecting litter daily to uphold the area's aesthetic standards.
