- The department hosted a Pump Operations 1 and 2 class at Newport Twp. Fire. The classes were attended by 12 of the paid operators and three of the volunteer firefighters. This was a joint class with Nanticoke Fire Dept. Emergency Vehicle Operator Course is scheduled for June. All the operators as well as a few volunteer firefighters are going to take the Driver/Operator- Pumper certification at the end of June. This is a professional Proboard certification given by the PA State Fire Academy. Nanticoke is also participating in this certification testing with us. Getting our staff certified makes us look better for grant purposes, professional recognition, as well as having our operators held to a professional standard. These classes have been great to build comradery between us and Nanticoke as well as help develop working knowledge of both department's resources and capabilities.
- Members of Newport Twp. Fire have been participating in trainings being hosted by Nanticoke Fire. Currently members are participating in Trench Rescue series and Decision Making for Initial Operations with a few more scheduled for May. Myself and Chief Boncal are working to schedule a Stand Pipe and Sprinkler Class as a joint class between our departments.
- We are looking into becoming a Participating Department with the PA State Fire Commissioner's Office. This is a voluntary program which requires a certain number of members to achieve professional firefighting certification, such as the Driver/ Operator certification and Firefighter 1 and 2.
- We are hoping to finalize department Standard Operating Procedures for the department.
